



Project Update

Martinsburg Veterans Affairs Medical Center

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The mission of the Martinsburg Veteran Affairs Medical Center (MVAMC) is to honor America's Veterans as Heroes by providing the highest quality health care.

To meet this complex mission, the MVAMC is continuously improving programs, services, and facilities to provide patient-centered health care.

The MVAMC currently has many renovations, upgrades and new construction projects designed to help us provide the best care possible to our Veterans.

During Fiscal Year 2011, \$18.1M was awarded under various funding projects, many for infrastructure improvements. These projects are underway and we will continue to provide periodic highlights via Project Updates and the Internet.

CLC Cultural Transformation to Renovate Bldg. 500.

The project renovates the Building 500 5B wing for single patient Community Living Center rooms. Construction got underway in December 2011 and project completion is anticipated in November 2012.

CLC 10 Bed Expansion

The project constructs a new 10-bed expansion on the west wing of Bldg. 501A to provide single-patient rooms with private baths. The design of the addition is consistent with the "Plantree" philosophy. Currently, construction is 65 percent complete with project completion anticipated in May 2012.

407B Renovation for Quality Management

Project will renovate Building 407B for the relocation of Quality Management Service. The project design incorporates a geothermal heating system, light harvesting and other energy efficient design practices. When complete, this building will be the model of sustainable building design for the Martinsburg VA Medical Center. Construction began on the project in January of 2012 and is scheduled to complete in July 2012.

Radiology Renovations

Project will renovate a portion of the existing Imaging Service to create a new outpatient waiting room, inpatient waiting room, and sub waiting rooms within the department. The project will improve patient way-finding by establishing architectural cues that designate specialty care patient waiting locations. The renovations will provide an enlarged outpatient waiting, a separate waiting area for inpatient gurneys and dramatically improved departmental aesthetics. Currently, the first of five phases of construction has been completed. The overall completion of the project is anticipated in June 2012.

311B Renovations for Simulation Lab

The project renovates Building 311B for use as a Simulation Lab for staff education. The Simulation Lab will provide training in a simulated real world environment. The project began in January 2012 and is anticipated to be completed in September 2012.

ADA Restroom Enhancements

Project will provide large "airport-like" hands free public restrooms in renovated space adjacent to the Medical Center lobby and canteen to serve the patients, staff and visitors of the Medical Center. The hands free design will lower the potential to spread infections. Construction began in August 2011 and the projects is expected to be complete in

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
